Introduction

This Capital Improvements Element (CIE) Annual Update has been prepared based on the rules and regulations pertaining to impact fees in Georgia, as specified by the Development Impact Fee Act (DIFA) and the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) documents Development Impact Fee Compliance Requirements and Standards and Procedures for Local Comprehensive Planning. These three documents dictate the essential elements of an Annual Update, specifically the inclusion of a financial report and a schedule of improvements.

According to the Compliance Requirements, the Annual Update:

"...must include: 1) the Annual Report on impact fees required under O.C.G.A. 36-71-8; and 2) a new fifth year schedule of improvements, and any changes to or revisions of previously listed CIE projects, including alterations in project costs, proposed changes in funding sources, construction schedules, or project scope." (Chapter 110-12-2-.03(2)(c))

This Annual Update itself is based on the Peachtree City Capital Improvements Element, as adopted by the City on April 9, 2017.

Financial Report

The Financial Report included in this document is based on the requirements of DIFA, specifically:

"As part of its annual audit process, a municipality or county shall prepare an annual report describing the amount of any development impact fees collected, encumbered, and used during the preceding year by category of public facility and service area." (O.C.G.A. 36-71-8(d)(1))

The City's fiscal year runs from October 1 to September 30. Thus, the financial report included here is based on the audit prepared for FY 2017. The required financial information is summarized in Table 1, and detailed information for each public facility category appears in tables 3 through 5.

Schedule of Improvements

In addition to the financial report, the City has prepared a five-year schedule of improvements (Community Work Program (CWP), as specified in the Compliance Requirements (Chapter 110-12-2-.03(2)(c)), which states that local governments that have a CIE must "update their entire Short Term Work Program (Community Work Program) annually." The required annual CWP update addendum is presented as Table 6.
