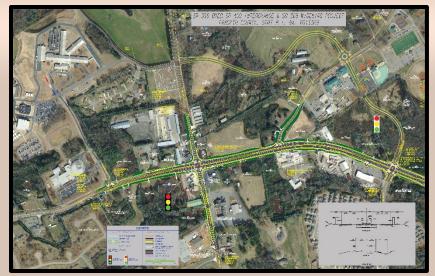

#### **Background**

To continue the Impact Fee Program, Forsyth County is responsible for preparing annual updates of our Capital Improvement Element. This report is prepared for review by the Board of Commissioners prior to presentation at a public hearing for citizen comments. Following the public hearing, the report is transmitted to the Atlanta Regional Commission for compliance review by both the State Department of Community Affairs and the Atlanta Regional Commission. The Capital Improvement Element is comprised of both a 2020 Annual Financial Report and an updated Schedule of Improvements.

#### **Agenda Item**

As outlined in the Department of Community Affairs Guide for annual updates, the Board of Commissioner authorization is required to transmit the 2020 draft of the Capital Improvement Element and Community Work Program to the Atlanta Regional Commission. The transmittal resolution must include a statement to certify a public hearing was officially held. Following the public hearing, the draft of the Capital Improvement Element and Community Work Program addendum will be submitted with the resolution to the Atlanta Regional Commission for review. Once the report is determined to be in compliance with the Georgia Development Impact Fee Act of 1989 and approved by the Department of Community Affairs, Board of Commissioner approval will be requested to adopt the update and notify the Atlanta Regional Commission of official adoption.
