

INTRODUCTION



This is an exciting time for the Town of Brooks. We're a great place to be in the Atlanta region - our residents love living here, with public surveys showing excellent community ratings. Broadly speaking, a comprehensive plan is a way to guide investment, development and the allocation of services within a jurisdiction. But cities, towns and counties are complicated places, and they make decisions about the future every day, in response to new opportunities or unexpected problems. A Comprehensive Plan like The Town of Brooks' Comprehensive Plan is one tool for helping to guide these decisions, with three distinctive features:

- •It is long-range, looking ahead 5, 10, or 25 years
- •It is comprehensive, looking across many different facets of what a Town does
- •It is deliberative, looking within to understand the needs and desires of the Town

Most of the work of shaping the Town of Brooks' future will be done by the residents and businesses. The Town of Brooks' government has a key role to play through these implementation tools:

- Regulations
- Capital spending
- Programs

The success of the goals of the Town of Brooks depends on being able to tap into the many voices of the town and weave their ideas, viewpoints, and thoughts into a common vision. Outreach and engagement were critical to reach a broad consensus of the diverse people who live and work in the town.

To meet the goal of an inclusive process meant creating multiple venues and opportunities for involvement. The planning team developed communication tools to ensure meaningful community involvement that would form the backbone of the plan.

A Steering Committee was convened to oversee the process and guide the development of the plan. Steering Committee Members were appointed by Town Manager Maurice Ungaro, and included Mayor Daniel Langford, Kay Brumbelow, Brian Davis, Shane Blalock, and Lieze Harris.

A Public Input page and survey was created to inform residents about the comprehensive plan update process and to solicit their feedback on key issues. Paper copies of the survey were available at Town Hall and local businesses. Together, 234 people participated in the survey. In addition to the site and survey, a virtual public meeting was held. These forms of participation were advertised on the Town of Brooks website and social media pages.

These inputs assisted the Steering Committee and the Planning Team in creating goals for the Town of Brooks. These goals recognize that the Town of Brooks is a forward-looking community, engaged in shaping its own future.




Who We Are

The Town of Brooks is one of metro Atlanta's smallest incorporated communities. Located in Southern Fayette County, Brooks is a rural crossroad community centered on 85 Connector. Fayetteville, the county seat of Fayette County, is 13 miles to the north, and Griffin is 15 miles to the southeast.


With a small population, the Town of Brooks has had a varied population over the last 15 years. Currently the US Census estimates the population of Brooks to be 568 people, which is a slight increase from its 2010 population of 494.

The proportion of non-Hispanic Brooks residents identifying as races other than White, Black, Asian, has increased significantly over the last decade, from 5 to 37.


The proportion of Brooks residents identifying as Hispanic or Latinx has decreased to 2.5% from 3.8%.

The Economy of Brooks

The Town of Brooks has employees in eight different job sectors: Educational Services, Construction, Manufacturing, Public Administration, Real Estate and Rental and Leasing, Administration & Support, Waste Management and Remediation, Wholesale Trade, and Other Services (excluding Public Administration). The jobs held by Brooks residents are much more diverse than those within the town. Educational Services, is the most common industry among Brooks residents, followed by Health Care and Social Assistance.

RESIDENT AREA CHARACTERISTICS




What industries do Brooks residents work in?

Housing

Housing within the Town of Brooks is all single-family. Currently there is about a 12% vacancy rate and about 12% of the homes are rental properties. There are approximately 226 homes in Brooks.

Transportation

The Town of Brooks is situated along the Highway 85 Connector. This road serves as the Main Street through the town. All other streets are local streets serving individual residential areas and are dedicated streets maintained by town. The 2017 Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax vote allowed the town to expand its capital projects with some key repaving projects and intersection upgrades, however large capital projects are limited in the future.

Fayette County's Comprehensive Transportation Plan identifies the abandoned Norfolk Southern rail line as a rail-to-trail project. Therefore, the town should actively monitor these plans, encourage citizen participation, and assist the County in executing the project.




METRO ATL HOUSING STRATEGY




What We Heard

A Public Input page was created to provide information about the comprehensive planning process, project updates, and to host a survey. The survey contained questions about assets and challenges, what residents would like to see, transportation and housing needs, natural resources, and culturally and historically significant sites.

A paper-based version of the survey was also made available at several locations throughout the town. Altogether, the survey was completed by 234 individuals. The survey was open through February and March and was advertised on Brooks social media pages. A complete record of the responses can be found in the appendix.

On February 1st, 2022, the Town of Brooks and the Atlanta Regional Commission hosted a Virtual Public Meeting to provide information about the planning process and to hear residents' thoughts about what they would like to see over the next five years.


Strongest Assets in Brooks

Needs and Opportunities

- How to manage growth while protecting the unique atmosphere that drew the people who call the Town of Brooks home
- With limited financial resources, opportunities for capital projects are limited
- More broadband coverage

The following opportunities were identified:


- Attract businesses downtown, such as a coffee shop and corner store

- Use the Georgia State Road Race as a catalyst to demonstrate the benefits of cycling to the town

Community Goals

The Town of Brooks is a diverse and forward-looking community engaged in shaping its own future. The people of Brooks are working to capitalize on the qualities and values that have made it a successful community. These goals below seek to address those issues identified and provide a basis for investments and decision making.

- · Create systems to assure the maintenance and enhancement of the town
 - Work with Fayette County on providing trail connections around town
 - Work with ARC to identify areas for sidewalk construction
- Improve the intrinsic value of the town through community spaces
 - Create awareness about Brooks with historic markers or plaques
 - Promote awareness of historic tax credits for opportunities for reinvestment
- Encourage any new development to align with and support the town's rural past
 - Town council or a to-be-formed zoning committee could conduct periodic reviews of the zoning ordinance
- Explore opportunities to strengthen citizen involvement in the government

 - Create committees to tackle Town issues such as historic preservation and planning and zoning committees

Future Land Use



Land Use

The Town of Brooks is characterized by a town center and surrounding agriculture and rural residential uses. The minimum lot size within the Main Street Character Area is one acre. In the Agricultural-Residential Area, the minimum lot size is five acres. Currently, about 1/3 of the Town's lots are smaller than five acres. At present, there is no sewer service within the town nor plans to develop a sewer system beyond the double septic tank system serving much of downtown.

As a first step in creating an appropriate development atmosphere, the town has developed "Character Areas." These "Character Areas" are intended to ensure compatible and unified development within specified areas of the City. The Future Development Map is broken into the following Character Areas:

- Main Street
- Agricultural-Residential

Main Street


Main Street is comprised of historic properties, commercial uses, single family homes and institutional uses essential to the fabric of the community. Preservation of those historic properties that remain is important to Brooks' sense of place. Any new development or redevelopment should complement the historic nature and scale of Brooks' Main Street.

Agricultural Residential


The Agricultural-Residential character area is comprised of properties on large lots, which start at five acres. Common open space and site amenities are not typical in Brooks, as residents appear to favor a less structured environment.



A. Broadband Access

Broadband Access

Senate Bill 402, known as the ACE Act (Achieving Connectivity Everywhere), directs local communities to address broadband availability in local comprehensive plans. The local government must make an objective determination of whether it is served by broadband service. Appropriate follow-up steps must be identified based on the community's determination of whether it is served by broadband.

The following map identifies broadband service in Brooks.

As used in this section: "Broadband services" means a wired or wireless terrestrial service that consists of the capability to transmit at a rate of not less than 25 megabits per second in the downstream direction and at least 3 megabits per second in the upstream direction to end users and in combination with such service provides:

- Access to the Internet: or
- Computer processing, information storage, or protocol conversion.

And "Broadband services provider" means any provider of broadband services or a public utility or any other person or entity that builds or owns a broadband network project.

Comprehensive Plan Update Steering Committee Meeting #1

Monday, December 6, 2021, Virtual, at 6:00 PM

Meeting Summary:

The meeting began with introductions of the steering committee, Town of Brooks staff, and ARC staff. Introductions were followed by a slide deck reviewing population, housing, transportation, income, and other relevant data for the town of Brooks. The presentation of data was followed by a set of questions to the steering committee aimed to understand the strengths and challenges in the community, specific considerations for community engagement, and a review of the needs and opportunities form the last plan update to see which items still fit, whether any needed to be updated or removed, and whether any new items need to be added. Responses are below.

What are the best assets in Brooks?

- Small town, everyone knows each other
- Local businesses
- Beautiful countryside, homes on at least five acre lots
- Neighbors know each other
- Beautiful downtown
- People are fiercely proud of being from Brooks
- A stable and thriving small town

Review of Needs:

From the last update, the needs of managing parking in the downtown area has been addressed. A ten space lot has been added downtown and more street parking and spaces are in the pipeline. Accordingly, this need can be removed from the list. The remaining needs remain. More broadband coverage is to be added to the update.

Add to needs: More broadband coverage. Thinking ahead, it was mentioned that Spaulding has a broadband initiative. Brooks Council was told they need to e looking towards leaning into Spaulding's initiative to run the cabling up the road to Brooks. This is a necessary step for more folks to move in to areas without Broadband.

Review of Opportunities:

The steering committee identified several opportunities for the town, including attracting businesses downtown, such as a coffee shop and corner store, improving septic system capacity downtown to allow for new businesses, developing a rail trail, hosting more events to get the community together, such as

food truck days, an annual Brooks festival, and a summer festival, and using the Georgia State Road Race, or other opportunities, to help demonstrate the benefits of cycling to the town.

Community engagement considerations:

The steering committee noted a distinction between residents living in the town of Brooks, and those living in the Brooks zip code. While all ideas are welcome, want to ensure that the ideas of residents are understood and prioritized. A question to distinguish residents is to be added to the survey. There are several other questions the steering committee suggested be added to the survey, including, "what is missing for you in Brooks?", a map-based question to help identify areas where traffic speeding is a concern, and a question to understand how people feel about the existing five-acre rule.

Town of Brooks

Comprehensive Plan Update Steering Committee Meeting #2

Wednesday, January 19, 2022, Virtual, at 6:00 PM

Meeting Summary:

The meeting consisted of a review of community goals, future land use and characteristics, and the draft of the Public Input site and survey to be advertised to residents as virtual engagement.

Community goals review:

- 1. Create systems to ensure the maintenance and enhancement of the town
 - Work with Fayette County on providing trail connections around town
 - Work with ARC to identify areas for sidewalk construction

The steering committee decided this goal and the potential steps to achieve it still fit.

- 2. Improve intrinsic value of the town through community spaces
 - Identify opportunities to list Brooks on the National Register of Historic Places
 - Create awareness about Brooks with historic markers or historic plaques
 - Promote awareness of historic tax credits for opportunities for reinvestment

The steering committee decided the first bullet point is not actionable and should be removed from the update, but the other steps and main goal still apply.

- 3. Encourage any new development to align with and support the town's rural past
 - · Update the zoning code to ensure it matches the Town's vision

The steering committee decided the main goal still applies, but the bullet point no longer applies as the zoning code has been updated. The committee suggested the addition of a new bullet point, stating that the council or possibly a yet-to-be-formed zoning committee could conduct periodic reviews of the zoning ordinance every few years.

- 4. Explore opportunities to strengthen citizen involvement in the government
 - "Continue" to Promote the Town website and promote social media channels
 - Create committees to tackle town issues such as historic preservation, planning and zoning, or communications-committees

The steering committee asked that the word "continue" be added at the beginning of the first bullet point, as this goal is underway. Additionally, "communications" is to be removed from the second bullet, noting that what is most needed is a planning and zoning committee. A historic preservation committee could be relevant, but a communication committee is not needed at this time.

The committee recommended that a new point be added, to address capital improvement projects. Steps to address this should include addressing the stormwater system in town, the septic system, and the water system through capital projects.

Future Land Use review

The steering committee indicated that the future land use map is to remain the same.

Comprehensive Plan Update Steering Committee Meeting #3

Wednesday, February 23, 2022, Virtual, at 6:00 PM

Meeting Summary:

The third and final meeting consisted of a review of the major themes and findings from the public engagement process. This included results from the public meeting and the survey on assets, challenges, culturally and historically significant sites, Brooks' five-acre rule, natural and environmental resources, what residents would like to see, housing needs, top improvements to downtown. These results were discussed with regard to what should be prioritized in the community work program. The meeting concluded with a review of the changes to the plan's assets and challenges, and community goals.


Themes from the engagement process:

- Assets
 - o Small town, safe, low commercialization
- Challenges
 - o Growth, internet, speeding, need for a coffee shop downtown
- Quality of life
 - o 93% high, 7% average, 0% low
- Culturally or historically significant sites
 - o Downtown churches, cemeteries, ball field
 - The steering committee mentioned there could be future opportunities for maintenance of the ball parks and cemeteries
- Five acre rule
 - Supported by 97% of respondents
- Natural and environmental resources
 - Keep housing density low and acreage requirement, keep as much forest as possible for wildlife
- What folks would like to see
 - o No changes, a non-chain coffee shop, the railroad converted to a multi-use path
- Housing need
 - o Keep subdivisions out, create a volunteer home repair assistance program
 - The steering committee mentioned that local philanthropic and religious organizations might be able to help with this idea, to help partner volunteers with those in town who have housing repair needs.
- Top project downtown
 - o Septic improvements, maintenance of downtown buildings, dog park
 - The steering committee said that while one building downtown is blighted, most are in good shape. Some residential structures near downtown need some upkeep. The committee also mentioned that there might be potential for a dog park between the existing ball fields.

In addition to the noted comments, the steering committee also mentioned that more community events such as food truck days, and more support for local businesses would benefit the community.

From the themes identified in the public engagement process, the steering committee decided the priorities should be to focus on small businesses, sewage, and encouraging foot traffic in order to support small businesses downtown. It was noted that sewage might have to be a long range goal






How long have you lived in Brooks?
