City of Grayson 2000-2005 Short Term Work Program Summary of Accomplishments

October 10, 2004

I. Introduction

The City of Grayson will conclude its 2000-2005 Short Term Work Program as of December 31, 2005. During the past six months, the City has assessed the status of projects on the current Short Term Work Program and developed a project list to guide the City for the next three-year period.

The Short Term Work Program is included in the City's Comprehensive Plan. The program is incorporated as a tool for implementing the goals outlined within the Comprehensive Plan. Based upon data collected in the plan, the community's needs are analyzed and specific projects are developed. The finished product of the Short Term Work Program is essentially a list of projects that the City should focus its efforts for each year for a three-year period.

Citizen input is an important part of updating the Short Term Work Program. Public participation will promote a better understanding of the community, of the planning process and of the types of decisions City leaders must make. During public participation, citizens can voice their opinions about what they would like to be accomplished and what they would like to see their community to become. This input should then guide planners in creating the Short Term Work Program.

The City of Grayson has been highly effective in implementing the previous Short Term Work Program. This work program has been used as a guide for government action and in determining the allocation of City resources. Projects contained within the work program are either completed or ongoing. Projects that were not completed were due to circumstances beyond the control of the City or because of changing priorities since the Five-Year Program was created.

Following is a summary of the projects contained in the 2000-2005 Short Term Work Program and an assessment of their current status. Projects have been implemented in phases and there was not any distinction made upon the year in which they were implemented. The projects are grouped according to the elements of the Comprehensive Plan.

II. Economic Development

Project 1: Prepare a marketing brochure.

Work began on this project and was completed in the year 2001. The marketing brochure was produced as a "General Use Highway Map" and was distributed by a local area business.

Project 2: Correspondence with potential businesses.

Correspondence with potential businesses is an ongoing process, usually coordinated by the mayor. The mayor serves as the initial point of contact for those desiring to locate within the City's jurisdictional boundaries.

Project 3: Develop an "Uptown Grayson" revitalization committee.

Work began on this project in 2003. Coordination took place with the City Attorney regarding the establishment of a "Downtown Development Authority". This organization has yet to be established; however, there are plans to implement such authority.

Project 4: Enhance the entrances into the City.

Work was completed on this project in 2003. Signage entering the City was constructed of a durable material and placed strategically at "Gateways" into the City, along with appropriate landscaping.

Project 5: Seek methods of business attraction for professional/office uses.

The City continues to work with potential businesses that wish to locate within the City.

III. Natural and Historic Resources

Project 6: Continue intergovernmental cooperation within watersheds.

Adopted Gwinnett County Development Regulations and Amendments to the Gwinnett County Development Regulations.

Project 7: Locate groundwater, wetland, floodplain, soil types and endangered habitats on a parcel-by-parcel basis.

Work for this project has been ongoing and not yet completed due to budgetary constraints.

Project 8: Prepare a historic resources survey.

Work for this project has been ongoing and not yet completed due to budgetary constraints.

Project 9: Initiate a program (small signs, brochures, etc.) that explains the history surrounding identified resources, as well as the benefits of preserving them.

Work for this project has been ongoing and not yet completed due to budgetary constraints.

IV. Community Facilities

Project 10: City official correspondence with state and local transportation officials for the purpose of systematic roadway improvements and upgrades.

Work for this project is ongoing and usually performed by each council member on a case-bycase basis.

Project 11: Assess the City's sidewalk system and investigate funding alternatives for installation.

Work for this project has been coordinated through a combination of Gwinnett County SPLOST funds and current development guidelines that require the installation of sidewalks. This project will continue to be a priority for the City.

Project 12: Adopt water conservation strategies.

No action has been taken due to budgetary constraints.

Project 13: Coordinate with the Environmental Health Department to identify areas where septic tanks may fail in the near future.

No action has been taken. Gwinnett County may be coordinating a program for failing septic systems.

V. Housing

Project 14: Encourage the preservation of older homes.

Work for this project is on going as a portion of the zoning and development process.

VI. Land Use

Project 15: Create a GIS database for Land Use purposes.

Work for this project is on going and not completed. The City is currently revising the zoning ordinance and has annexed several parcels of property.

Project 16: Streetscape Uptown Grayson.

Work for this project has not been completed. The City unsuccessfully applied for a TE grant that encompassed the "Uptown Grayson" district. Future streetscape development may be implemented through coordination with development.

Project 17: Acquire parkland in the downtown district.

The City acquired additional parkland within the downtown district as of 2002.

VII. General Government

Project 18: Upgrade computer and software for the City Hall.

This project was completed in the year 2001.
