### RESOLUTION NO. 06-09-08Z

A RESOLUTION TO TRANSMIT A MAJOR UPDATE TO THE SHORT TERM WORK PROGRAM / CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT ELEMENT FOR THE CITY OF LOCUST GROVE PORTION OF THE HENRY COUNTY-CITIES JOINT COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN TO THE ATLANTA REGIONAL COMMISSION FOR REGIONAL AND STATE REVIEW; TO AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO EXECTUE AND DELIVER ANY DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THIS RESOLUTION; TO REPEAL INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City of Locust Grove, Georgia ("City") held a public hearing on September 5, 2006 to transmit an update the Short Term Work Program Element and CIE for the City of Locust Grove portion of the Henry County-Cities Joint Comprehensive Development Plan;

WHEREAS, the City has prepared an amendment in accordance with the guidance in the Minimum Standards under the Georgia Planing Act and the Rules and Regulations by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs as shown in Exhibit "A";

WHEREAS, notice of this matter (as attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "B") has been provided in accordance with applicable state law and local ordinances;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council wish to submit the amendment of the Short Term Work Program and CIE to the Atlanta Regional Commission for Regional and State review, as per the requirements of Minimum Planning Standards by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council wish to submit a Statement of Accomplishments of the Short Term Work Program and CIE, including all elements of land use changes within the reporting year, to the Atlanta Regional Commission for Regional and State review, as per the requirements of Minimum Planning Standards by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council in the exercise of their sound judgment and discretion, after giving thorough thought to all implications involved, and keeping in mind the public interest and welfare to the citizens of the City, have determined this amendment to be in the best interests of the citizens of the City, that this Resolution be adopted.

## THEREFORE, IT IS NOW RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOCUST GROVE, GEORGIA, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Authorization. That the Locust Grove City Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to submit the Short Term Work Program Element and CIE updates to the Atlanta Regional Commission for Regional and State review, as per the requirements of the Minimum Planning Standards of the Georgia Department of Community Affairs.
- 2. **Public Purpose.** The City finds that the foregoing actions constitute a major stem in preserving the health, safety, well being and economic vitality of the community and are,

therefore, consistent with its public purposes and powers.

- 3. **Attestation.** That the Locust Grove City Council hereby authorizes the City Clerk to attest the signature of any City official appearing on documents necessary to carry out this Resolution, to affix the official seal of the City thereto, as necessary, and to place this Resolution and any related documents among the official records of the City for future reference.
- 4. **Severability.** To extent any portion of this Resolution is declared to be invalid, unenforceable, or nonbinding, that shall not affect the remaining portions of this Resolution.
- 5. **Repeal of Conflicting Provisions.** All City resolutions are hereby repealed to the extent they are inconsistent with this Resolution.
- 6. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

### **EXHIBIT "A"**

AMENDMENT TO SHORT TERM WORK PROGRAM ELEMENT AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT ELEMENT FOR THE CITY OF LOCUST GROVE PORTION OF THE HENRY COUNTY-CITIES JOINT COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN

### **Short Term Work Program and CIE Update**

The City of Locust Grove has undergone tremendous growth since 2000, adding over 8 square miles of land area into the city limits through an aggressive annexation policy. In addition, the city constructed a major wastewater treatment facility along Indian Creek at the Butts County line. This major facility opened up a large area of the southern portion of Henry County for more intense development of commercial and residential land use.

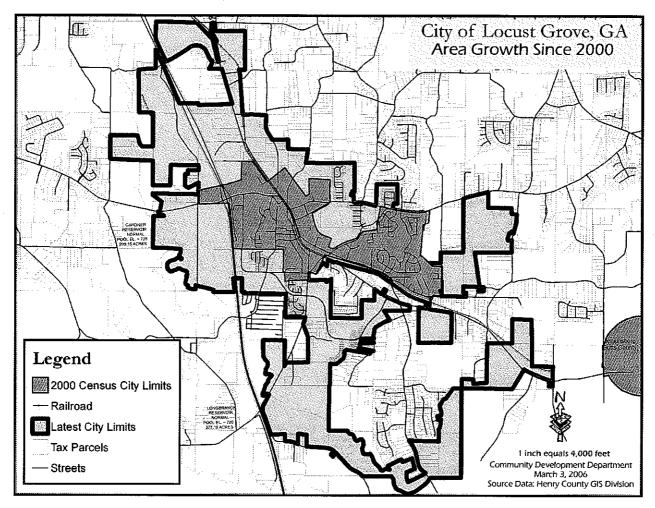


Figure 1. Growth in city limits since 2000. Area in orange shows new territory added into the city. Area in magenta is the old 2000 Census Boundary for the City of Locust Grove.

### Adjustment in Reporting Due to New Development Impact Fee Ordinance

The city adopted a Development Impact Fee Ordinance with a revised CIE in June of 2005. The reporting period was adjusted accordingly for the timing of audited financial statement of the first partial year of impact fees, which is attached as part of this report.

### Report of Accomplishments for 2005 – 2006 Interim Reporting Period

From the attached report of accomplishments for the interim reporting period, a majority of the projects were either completed or underway.

### Major Accomplishments:

- Completion of the Indian Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant off Locust Road at Indian Creek/Butts County line. This project was completed at a cost of just over \$10,000,000 and replaces two oxidation ponds, one aging package treatment plant, and a spray irrigation field. The project also was designed to increase capacity initially, with modular expansion possible at lower costs in the future.
- Water Tower and improvements on the city's south side. This project, completed at a cost of \$1,093,000 more than doubles the city's ability to store water for adequate pressure and delivery.

### Projects Underway:

- Sewer Interceptors C, D, and E. A \$2 million project to extend sanitary sewer to the city's new northwestern properties and to take pumping stations offline, as well as the West Oxidation Pond. Engineering and planning are complete, with construction underway. Estimated completion in 2007.
- Warren Holder Park Expansion. This project adds much-needed football fields to this busy park at a projected cost of nearly \$2 million, including additional parking and a new street. The project is substantially complete, with stabilization of fields for use later in the Fall.
- Streetscape Project. Engineering is complete, with ROW acquisition underway on the downtown streetscape project. This is a TE-funded project and should be under construction by the end of 2006 or early 2007. Delays related to GaDOT review process contributed to this project moving at a slower pace (mainly ROW).
- Joint Comprehensive Plan. This element comes from the 2005 Service Delivery Strategy Agreement (SDS) between Henry County and the four cities. All governments have contributed for both land use and transportation planning. The plans should be completed and adopted in 2007.

Projects that were delayed or under reconsideration were mainly due to funding issues, as those projects were tied to federal, state, or regional funding. The Skyland water line replacement was delayed due to lack of CDBG; however, the city recently awarded \$500,000 for this project, scheduled for construction in Spring of 2007. Another project was the downtown overlay, which was anticipating LCI grant money. The city is now considering using in-house staff or another grant application for the same funding source.

In terms of CIE elements, the Courts/Police facility completed building plan assessment for construction in late 2007 or mid 2008.

### 2007 - 2011 Short Term Work Program and CIE Element

The attached, new 2007 – 2011 Short Term Work Program and CIE Element is attached, with some of the major elements addressed below:

### Water and Sewer

- The largest investment scheduled is to double the capacity of the Indian Creek Plan to 3 MGD. This investment is only 25% of the original investment and allows for more capacity as needed in the future.
- o Water Improvements are necessary to serve the growing population. In addition, there is replacement of older lines in the Skyland Community, a traditionally underserved population.

### Transportation

- o Much of the growing concern is with traffic in the City of Locust Grove.
- Many projects moving forward are private investments.
- o Much of the Impact-Fee projects are moving back due to funding concerns from state and federal sources. This shortfall is not unusual, as it is being faced throughout the region. An element in Planning is to reassess this portion of impact fees as part of the new CTP and methodology for assessment.

### Parks and Recreation

- One of our parks is to be completed in 2007 by private development as part of an agreement for new facilities for girls' softball.
- The Community Center/Conference Center is a desired facility to offer places to gather and for other social events. This comprises a major element of the new STWP.

Other projects are continuation of current planning efforts and the Courts Facility/Police Station.

### **Impact Fee Collection**

In the reporting year of 2005 (partial year), the development impact fees amounted to just under \$200,000, with only a minor portion expended as part of administration of the new program. These fees will be expended on projects on the CIE within the next six years as required under the Impact Fee enabling legislation.

### **Land Use Changes**

The city approved a major update for an Interim Future Land Use Plan and Map to account for the new annexation areas. This is to be combined with the joint planning efforts in 2007. No new activity has occurred in the reporting period.
