The scope of this project will consist of clearing and grubbing for the construction of a 2 mile trail system including a loop along the Chattahoochee River. The project will also construct a parking area and trail head along Roberts Drive at the overpass location with State Route 400.

If yes, please explain: This project will create a 2 mile trail system located in the Northern section of the Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area (Parcels E, D, & C) and in an 11 acre tract owned by the City of Sandy Springs (Parcel B). This trail path will link to the existing network of trails located within the Island Ford Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area located at the southern end of Island Ford Park (Parcel A). laborer is \$8.80 per hour. Between the above four organizations it is estimated that 6 people will be available as needed to assist with trail construction. As a result, these volunteer services total an estimated investment of 23% of the total project cost.

- 9. This project will provide direct connections to four resources. The project will run parallel to Roberts Drive and will be located on the opposite side of the road from the following communities: Dunwoody Town homes, River Crossing Apartment Homes, Riverside Place Apartment Homes, and the Dunwoody Plantation Town homes at the Chattahoochee Terrace. These communities will have direct access to the trail system as there will not be a physical barrier between the trail and Roberts Drive and there will be a trailhead at Roberts Drive and State Route 400. The trail system will also serve a host of other private residential communities that live along Roberts Drive as public awareness and community outreach spreads.
- 10. This project will be used to serve or provide access for the following five non-motorized uses: canoeing/ kayaking/ paddling sports, day hiking, and jogging/ fitness.
- 11. The City of Sandy Springs does not have any unfinished trail projects for which we have received Recreational Trails Program funds in the past as this is the City's first submission for the RTP grant program.

### Narrative Description of Proposed Project:

Rivers, forest and vegetation are not just amenities, but rather are a basic part of the infrastructure of any City. Without outdoor resources, a City is a sterile landscape. This trail facility will prove to be a positive investment for the City of Sandy Springs along the Chattahoochee, resulting not only in improved transportation alternatives, but in the enjoyment of the local surroundings.

The Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area provides 95% of all green space and park land in the City of Sandy Springs and there are approximately 80,000 visitors each year to the Island Ford Unit. The addition of this new trail system will nearly double the area currently accessible in the Island Ford Unit.

This project will provide outdoor recreational trail activities where there are currently no existing accommodations. This project will provide additional activities for the citizens of the City of Sandy Springs in the northern section of the Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area. The project will also connect land owned by the City to the National Park Service parcels thereby increasing the greenspace concentrated in this area.

This project will also provide direct access to recreational activities for those residents living in the northern section of the Roberts Drive corridor. Along with creating passive outdoor recreational activities, this project will enhance the community's recreational and scenic resources. As the trail loops around and traverses back southward the project will provide a beautiful scenic reflection of the Chattahoochee River.

The National Park Service is prepared to oversee the new trail area and provide ongoing maintenance of the trails. This project will be a very important part of the overall enjoyment of the Chattahoochee River National Recreational Area for years to come.
