PROJECT DESCRIPTION Windham Creek Greenway Trail

The Union City Recreational Trails Project will design and construct a 10-foot wide, paved, multi-use trail along the Windham Creek Greenway from Watson Street to Shannon Parkway, on City owned property. The approximate length of the project is 1500 feet and it will also include interpretative signage, benches, and trash receptacles along the trail for the enjoyment of its users. The trail will accommodate varied nonmotorized uses such as bicycling, rollerblading, walking, and jogging.

This project will serve as a catalyst to the implementation of a much needed recreational site within the City. Union City currently lacks many recreational amenities to offer its citizens. The City officials are adamant about the importance of providing such facilities and therefore have taken the lead to plan for the future with this goal in mind. This greenway trail will provide recreational amenities and protect the natural resources along the creek.



This project will bring the community a much needed respite from the overbearing commercial environment while at the same time preserving the City's natural resources. The area surrounding the creek is overwhelmed by commercial development. The majority of this area is marked by the suburban development. Shannon Mall is located to the South of the Creek and uses along this area are predominately commercial, including fast food restaurants, gas stations, and shopping centers. The proposed trail will bring the citizens closer to the creek, which hopes to motivate and educate them of the importance of preserving its natural beauty.

2. Land Use:

The Livable Centers Initiative (LCI) Town Center Study, which the City completed in 2003, evaluated the existing land uses in the 782 acres of the LCI Study area. The Study found that the majority of the area in the vicinity of Windham Creek is marked by the suburban development patterns found in traditional community developments. The following table summarizes the findings of the study regarding land uses.



Windham Creek borders on the South with the Shannon Mall area, which is currently marked by the low-density, automobile oriented commercial uses associated with interchanges (I-85). Many of these uses are fast food restaurants, gas stations, and shopping centers. These uses, with their accompanying parking areas, are the defining characteristic of this area. North of the creek, there is a large tract of multifamily residential developments while to the west are many older single-family homes and Union City's traditional downtown, which is now largely a governmental center (LCI, 1:28). The enclosed existing land use map depicts these findings.

The Windham Creek Greenway Trail project is consistent with the goals and objectives of the Union City Town Center Study. Those goals are equally consistent with the vision stated in the Union City Comprehensive Plan. Both documents state that the land surrounding Windham Creek must be protected and dedicated for recreational purposes. The Comprehensive Plan includes the existing and future land use classifications for the area. In the existing land use map, one can see that the majority of the land along the creek is currently undeveloped or vacant. The future land use shows that the area surrounding the creek is projected to house more commercial development. This is why the City is taking a proactive approach to protect and preserve this area. By dedicating the land to a greenway, the City ensures that this natural resource is safeguarded. The City has already taken strives to protect it by acquiring about two-thirds of the vacant land along the creek.

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
