Attachment 2 Rogers Bridge Greenway Trail

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Rogers Bridge Greenway Recreational Trails project application for funding proposes to develop 2700 feet of 5-foot wide trail along the Chattahoochee River as part of the Rogers Bridge Greenway, within the City of Duluth. The project will also include the provision of benches, trash receptacles, and educational nature signs at rest areas along the trail. Also, a pedestrian bridge will be necessary to cross a tributary along the trail.

Given the sensitive natural environment along the River, the chosen material is a rubber composite which is firm but permeable. The trail will be 5-foot wide, which will allow for comfortable wheelchair access. This material will provide a soft, comfortable surface for different types of users to feel at ease using the trail.

The proposed trail will be the beginning of a well planned and greatly anticipated system of trails along the Chattahoochee River. This project is all about linkages; Issue 7 of the 2003 Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (SCORP). The overall greenway trail is about 1.3 miles in length. This path will extend from the Abbott's Bridge Unit of the CRNRA to Rogers Bridge Park. The footpath will then continue from Rogers Bridge Park east through some forested uplands, and along the boundary of a wetlands area in the Suwanee Creek Unit of the CRNRA where portions of the trail will become boardwalk. This trail will be suitable for walking, jogging, birding and any other passive activities. The greenway plan calls for extensive reforestation. Much of the land along the river was cleared in the past for pastures and farming. Almost all of the property needed for the greenway has been acquired through purchases or easements.



All the amenities and design features will comply with the Principles and Guidelines section of the Chattahoochee River – Greenway Planning and Implementation Handbook, which was developed by The Chattahoochee River Land Protection Campaign. The guidelines set forth in that document apply to greenway implementation on public lands and all areas allowing public access along the Chattahoochee River Corridor.

The proposed Recreational Trails project will provide essential enhancements to the site in terms of accommodating visitors and promoting trail use by providing initial access to Rogers Bridge and the Chattahoochee River. Moreover, these improvements provide the framework for additional amenities to be developed in the future, including construction of the Welcome Center, parking areas, a boat launch, and the multi-use trail along Rogers Bridge Road and across the Rogers Bridge.

On behalf of the Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area, I am pleased to submit a letter in support of the Recreational Trails Application sponsored by the City of Duluth requesting funding for the Rogers Bridge Greenway Trail project.

Rivers, forests and vegetation are not just amenities, but rather are a basic part of the infrastructure of any city. Without outdoor resources, a city is a sterile landscape. This trail will prove to be a positive investment for the City of Duluth's greenway along the Chattahoochee, resulting not only in improved transportation alternatives, but in the enjoyment of the local surroundings.

The Rogers Bridge Greenway Trail will be a critical public access hub for the Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area, and will connect existing NPS, City of Duluth, and Fulton County lands.
