WHEREAS to maintain the certified local government status as a Qualified Local Government, the City of Canton has prepared the annual update to these documents including the Annual Report on Impact Fees in accordance with state law;

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the amendments as so hereby described and contained within the body of this resolution be transmitted to the Atlanta Regional Commission for their review and comment in accordance with their authority as the regional planning agency for the ten county metropolitan area;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and City Council hereby direct the Mayor's staff of the City of Canton to transmit the aforementioned documents to the Atlanta Regional Commission as required by the rules governing the Planning Act of 1989.
