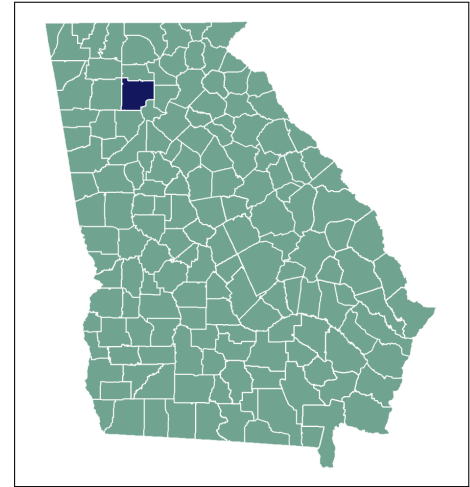




Cherokee County
