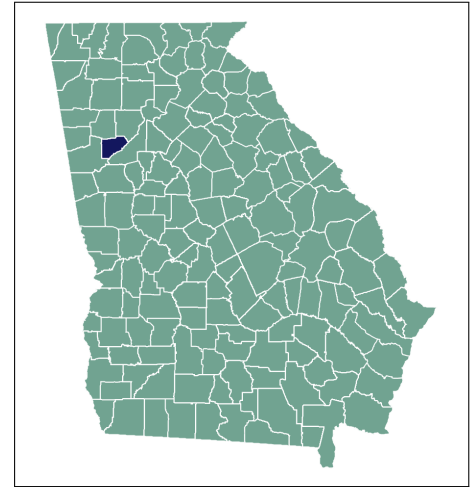




# Douglas County
