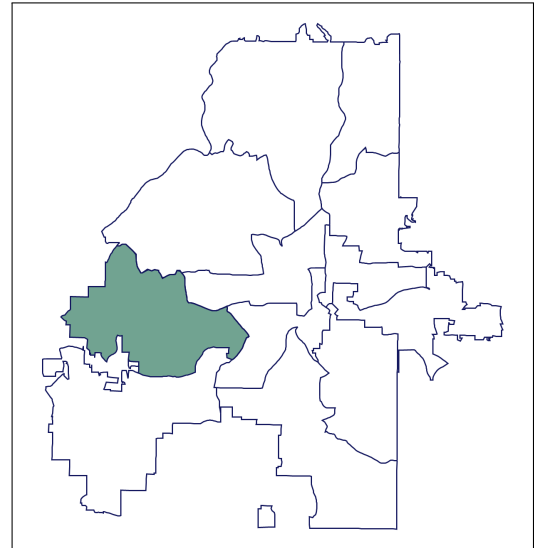




Atlanta City Council District 10
