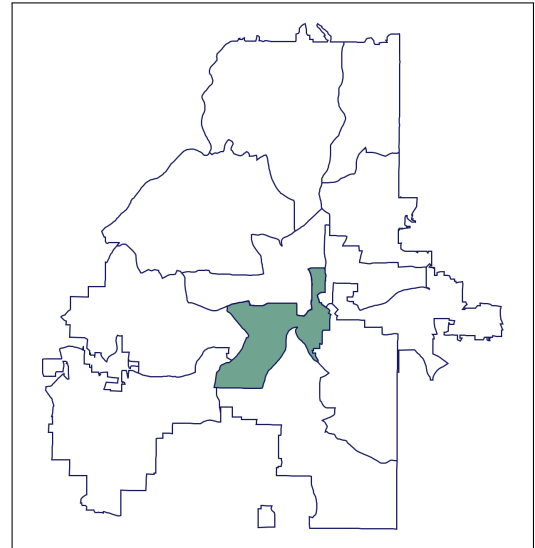




# Atlanta City Council District 4
