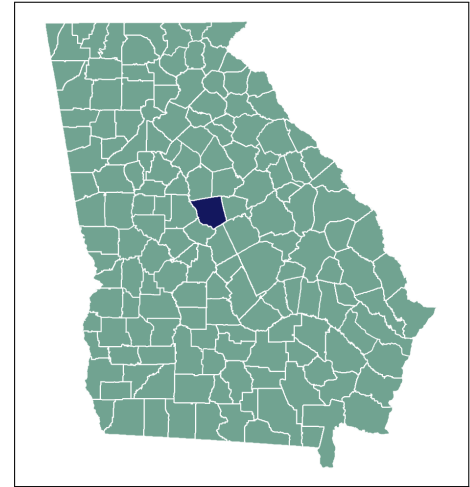




Jones County
