

Description, Purpose and Benefits This project involves a bridge reconnecting two sections of Walther Boulevard which were severed during construction of SR 316. This will provide Georgia Gwinnett College an alternative vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian access across SR 316. This extension will provide a route for college traffic to access living and shopping areas, thereby providing congestion relief to SR 316, SR 20, SR 124 and numerous local roads. Additionally the project will enhance the movement of freight, as well as provide pedestrian facilities. Removing the existing ramps connecting either side of the roadway with one travel direction of SR 316, and replacing it with a bridge with no connectivity with SR 316, will reduce conflict points that create crashes. An annual average of 16 crashes occur at the existing ramps (of which about 3 result in injuries) according to the Critical Analysis Reporting Environment (CARE) crash data system. The total cost of the project is \$10,600,000, which will be entirely funded under TIA.
