## Atlanta Regional Commission Invites Public Comment on the Amendment to the 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan and FY 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program

The Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) will open a public review and comment period on March 29, 2024 for a Planning Amendment to the 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and to the FY 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The public comment period will remain open until April 19, 2024.

The TIP is the mechanism by which federal, state, and local funds are approved for all significant transportation projects and programs in the region. The TIP comprises the first four years of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) for the Atlanta region. As the federally recognized Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for a 20-county\* region, ARC is responsible for developing and amending/updating the TIP and MTP to meet federal planning requirements and address local needs.

Amendment #1 was developed to incorporate new projects from GDOT's bridge program, handle miscellaneous financial changes which impact fiscal constraint, and assist with the closeout of FY 2024.

All amendments require a conformity determination from the US DOT, in consultation with the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). This Amendment #1 is expected to receive an updated conformity determination by the US DOT and US EPA by late May 2024. The most recent conformity determination was issued by US DOT and US EPA on February 27, 2024.

The public involvement process used to satisfy Federal Transit Administration (FTA) public participation requirements for FTA Section 5307 suballocated funds for all transit providers in the 20-county Transportation Management Area (TMA) is managed by the Atlanta-Region Transit Link (ATL) Authority which is the Designated Recipient for the Atlanta urbanized area. No changes to the current Program of Projects are being made in the Atlanta TIP at this time.

A summary of all comments received during the period and responses to those comments will be presented to ARC's technical and policy committees and the ARC Board for their consideration before taking action on the Planning Amendment.
