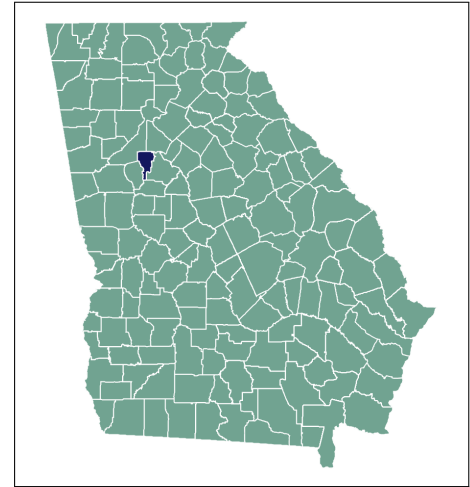




Clayton County
