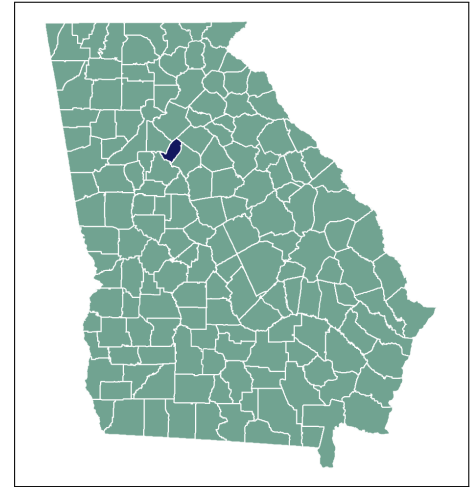




Rockdale County
